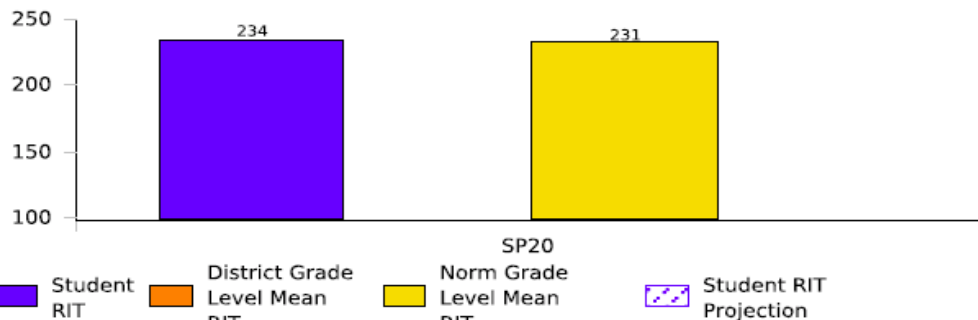

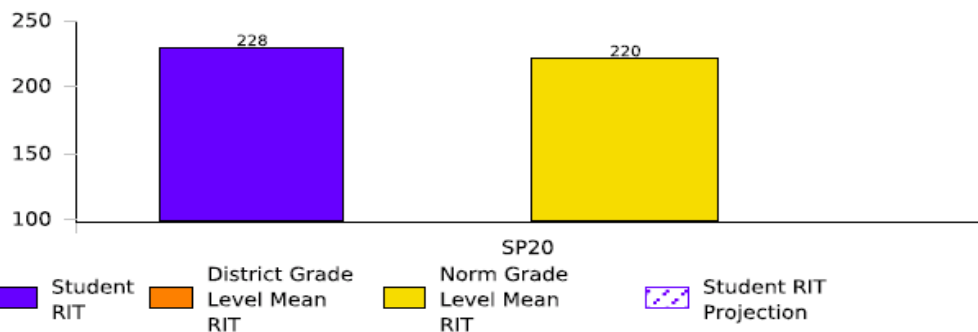

WHY INTEGRATED MATHEMATICS?

According to the former President of the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, “Ninety percent of the rest of the world teaches mathematics using an integrated approach.” The traditional approach to mathematics utilized by most schools in the United States is actually the EXCEPTION when compared to the rest of the world. Here are five reasons why an integrated approach to mathematics offers students a more impactful journey to becoming Men for Tomorrow:

Real-World Problem-Solving

An Integrated Mathematics curriculum includes concepts from algebra, geometry, statistics, and data analysis in each course rather than teaching them as separate, standalone courses like Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II. Content and transferable skills are organized thematically rather than in the traditional sequence, which allows more opportunities for students to connect and apply what they have learned in new, relevant contexts that reflect transfer and real-world problem-solving.

Project-Based Learning & Performance Assessments

An Integrated Mathematics curriculum better aligns with our Vision 175 promise of a Curriculum of Tomorrow--experiential, project-based learning and performance assessments that deliver authentic experiences that ultimately transcend the bounds of individual academic departments as we prepare our young men for the future.

ACT Content

Problems related to Probability and Statistics represent 8-12% of the content on the Mathematics section of the ACT Test. Approximately 40% of the problems focus on Integrating Essential Skills, which “measures how well a student can synthesize and apply his understandings and skills to solve more complex problems.” An Integrated Mathematics curriculum also offers the opportunity to engage our students in this type of standardized test material, preparing them for a broader range of content using a more comprehensive approach to learning.

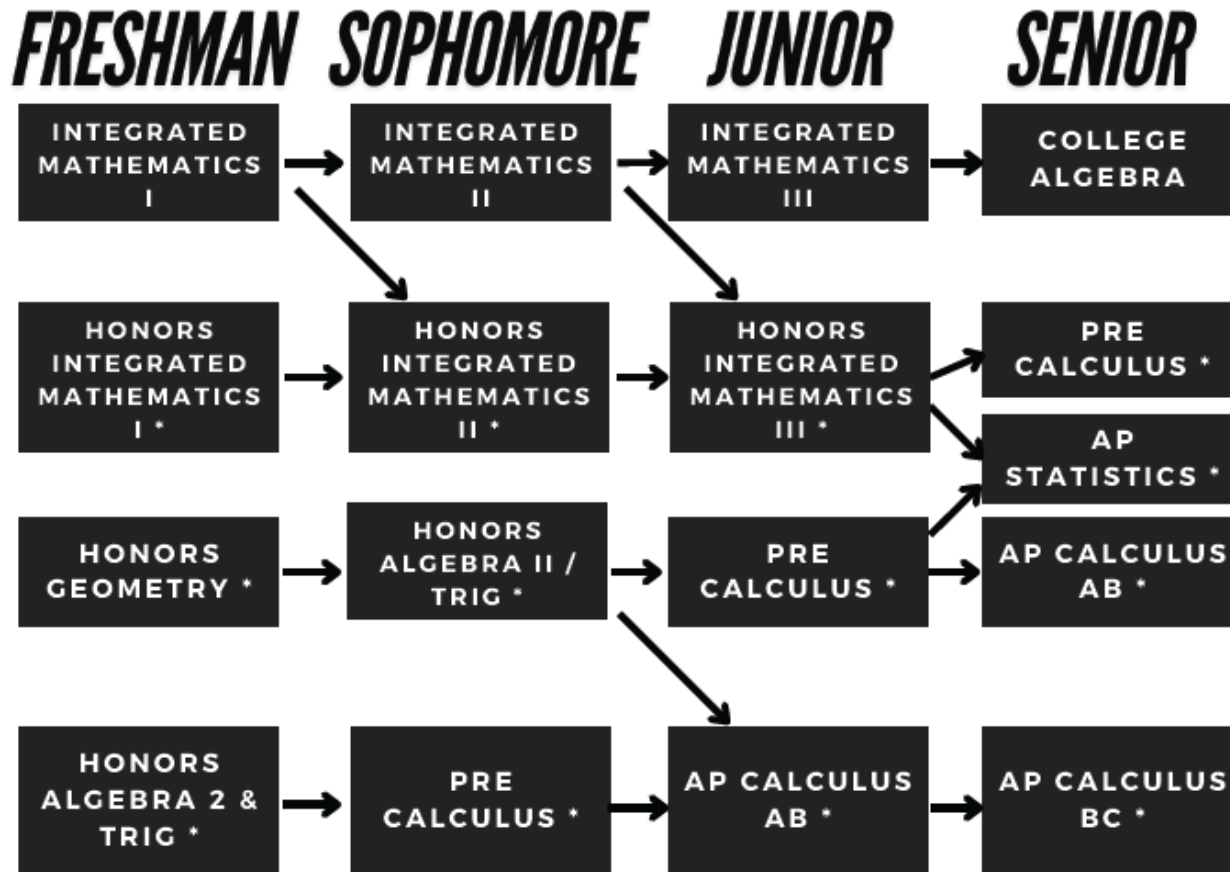
Minimizing Time Gaps

The transition to Integrated Mathematics will also shorten the time gaps between the teaching of essential concepts and skills and, hence, minimize the need to spend valuable time re-teaching material from year-to-year.

Preparing for Higher-Level Mathematics

Exposure to more relevant applications of algebra integrated with geometry and statistics throughout a CBC student’s mathematics courses will lead to more meaningful experiences and help build a foundation for choosing more relevant mathematics options in college.

4-YEAR PLANNING PROCESS

**4-YEAR PLANNING SESSION
FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

CBC offers the opportunity for an individual student and family consultation to help establish a 4-Year Plan for your son's high school experience.

What are the goals of the 4-Year Planning Session?

- Provide a roadmap for a student to help him maximize his CBC Experience.
- Ensure proper course prioritization and sequencing for students and families.
- Ensure that our planning processes align with the goals and objectives of a student and family.
- Provide a baseline for counselors and advisors for their future discussions with a student and family.
- Guidance on selecting primary and alternate electives for freshman year.
- Collaborate to identify opportunities for co-curricular involvement for a student.

What does a 4-Year Planning Session look like?

- The 4 Year Planning Session will last between 45 minutes and an hour and will be conducted in person at CBC (if an alternative method is preferred, please communicate with your representative).
- The discussion during each session will vary, depending on the student, his academic level, his goals and objectives, and his intended co-curricular experiences.
- Each family will complete a brief questionnaire when you register for a 4-Year Planning session to help drive the discussion with the 4-Year Planning Representative.
- The conversation will be led by the Representative, with input provided by the family and student.

How will families register for a 4-Year Planning Session?

- Over the next week, you will receive an email from your 4-Year Planning Representative (listed on the top right corner of your son's course selection sheet found in your folder).
- That email will include a link that will allow you to register for an available time slot and answer questions that will guide the discussion. Available appointments will be scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.

What is produced after the 4-Year Planning Session?

- At the end of the session, you will have selected primary and alternate electives for freshman year.
- There will be an "outline" of a potential path forward for core and elective class choices.
- This document will be uploaded on Blackbaud student portal and provided to his counselor.
- If applicable, 4-Year Planning Representative can provide connections to co-curricular opportunities and moderators.

Do I have to participate in a 4 Year Planning Session? No, but it is highly recommended.

Regardless, all families will need to register at the link provided to select primary and alternate electives for freshman year. This link will be sent to your email.

What is the timeframe for completing this consultation? Consultations will be completed by Friday, April 18th.

Can this plan change over the course of my time at CBC? *OF COURSE, IT CAN!* The goal is to make sure we are intentional about the steps we take over the course of four years. It most likely will change!


